Three years ago my wife and I decided to serve a mission for our church. We would be away from home for 1 1/2 years. Because of this I sold all of my pigeons 2 1/2 years ago. We had a marvelous time sharing the gospel for that time and returned home last January. I had foot surgery two weeks later. In the spring, I was getting antsie and decided it was time to have pigeons again. I called several of my Helmet friends to see if I could get some birds. Although it was the wrong time of year to be buying birds, I was delighted with how generous my Helmet friends were. My thanks goes out to Jim Garus, Mike LaCom Steve Mitchell, and Leonard Patito who shared some very top quality birds to start me up again. I worked with eight pair and raised 28 young. It was a good start. I look forward to showing at the National this year.

I have to admit that I have had great frustration in past years with the MF Helmet poor parenting. Twenty years ago it was not this way. Because of that frustration, I have decided not to keep as many pairs as I once did. I have decided to take the challenge to work to create top show quality duns. This is a somewhat neglected color and I am going to see if I have the breeding skills to put them into the winners circle. I invite you to join me. I only raised 4 duns this year of which I have kept two for the breeding program. Breeding with blacks, yellows, and duns, I now have several black cocks carrying dilute that will be mated to dun, yellow, and black hens this year. I expect a much bigger crop of dun youngsters to choose from next year. I an anxious to see what I can do.

I am pleased to welcome Curtis McBride into Helmets in District 8. Both Steve Mitchell and I have shared some good birds with him. He even had Best Helmet at the Utah State Fair this year. It is fun to have his enthusiasm around us.

Our Salt Lake City show was very small in Helmets this year. However, Steve and I did manage to share a few Helmets with new breeders. Hopefully we will see more activity here in the near future.

Thought from Dennis Manning

I've had the opportunity to visit two AHA meets so far this year one in District 2 and one in District 9. The District 9 show was the Western Sectional. Both shows were great. There is no denying the shows were a little sad as our good friend Dennis Bray was no longer with us but Dennis had raised some great birds this year before he passed and his birds were there so from time to time it felt like he was still there sitting in the gallery.

The competition at the AHA Western Sectional in Abbotsford BC was pretty good in the Plain Head section. Johny DeCarlo judged the birds and had a great group in the top five or six to choose from. John moved back and forth with a couple birds trying to decide and eventually settled on a red YC of Dennis Bray's. Dennis had been telling me he raised the winner this year and he was right!

The depth in the top PH birds was great with I think five breeders showing making for a good meet. Pavel Lutsenko had a nice silver in the running and Ernie had a family of silvers, yellows and blues that were competitive. The Bray birds were mostly reds as were mine and I think Hank Ebbelaar had a good yellow. Dennis Bray's red YC won the show.

The variation in size and type at our Western Sectional was much less than it was a few years ago. We've all been working hard to produce 8" birds up on their toes. That can be challenging with so many points on markings but a true champion will have it all.

I have finally had some reasonable progress with the almond project. I have struggled for the last ten years trying to produce some clear eyed almond or almond sub color birds that were showable. I raise an almond every now and then but always with a cracked eye. Giulio M gave me a cracked eyed true kite helmet cock bird some years ago, an obvious English Shortface cross bird but marked well enough to breed from. I have kept similar kites from that original bird every couple years but no luck with the eye. With only two almond mismarked cracked eyed birds and one similar kite hen to work with I pretty much gave up but the addition of some new crosses ESF/DSF crosses about four years ago I began getting some reds and blacks that occasionally threw kites. I crossed the two families this season and got a very showable kite and a dun that has some almond ground color in it's head feathers. Both marked well enough and most importantly both clear eyed. I'm back in business with the project. I will bring the kite to the National to show her off. She'll be an AOC bird. That's all for now see you all in LA.
